SUMMARY

As spring passed, NESFAS geared to take things up a notch by implementing the Indigenous Youth Fellowship Programme. The programme had a total of 25 participants from across Khasi, Jaintia and Garo Hills, armed with the objective to empower youth to have a better understanding on the importance of Indigenous Food Systems, biodiversity and intensifying the existing food crops in their respective villages for food security. The programme was a successful initiative as we are currently witnessing the implementation of various learnings at the ground level.

April marks an important occasion as we celebrated 'Earth Day 2021' themed 'Restore The Earth'. Our communications team developed a 30 seconds AV shared via Social Media reminding everyone about the practices one can adopt in their lives to help contribute to restoring our ecosystem.

We have also seen an increase in the livelihood sector with our partner organisation SURE (Jaintia Hills). Women coming to the fore to engaged in these activities added tremendous value to Indigenous women empowerment in the years to come.

On the innovation front, a majority of the community halls construction work has begun. The progress is promising to elevate community development and provide a safe space for exchange of dialogues and learning.






Out of 26 community halls, 11 are undergoing construction, the remaining constructions are on hold due to the lockdown.


